




Notley Fern Gorge is a remnant patch of rainforest hidden away for you to uncover via a weaving track that winds over creeks and amongst giant eucalyptus.

Lilydale Falls offers two impressive cascades connected by fern-framed steps that won't take too long to climb.

Gnarley mountain bike trails at George Town to Derby will get your heart racing and head planning more trips.
